
Our resolution for 2023 is to continue to be responsive to the needs of our customers on an individual and systemic level that allows us to meet the workforce development needs of our community.

Nicole went through the process of utilizing Brightside Up and helping her sister to become a legally exempt childcare provider whereby her sister may provide childcare that is authorized and paid for by the Department of Social Services for Nicole's children.

This resulted in her being hired full-time by Living Resources. Nicole has secured hours that still allow for her to be present and attend her children's school and sport activities. Schenectady County Connects helps BOCES students with resume building

As we build our partnerships within the local school districts - we have been fortunate to be invited into the BOCES Cosmetology classes to facilitate workshops on resume development, create and, in some cases, update student resumes, and educate students on interviewing skills. ALBANY – Job coaches with Schenectady County Connects met with juniors in the Capital Region BOCES Cosmetology program on Thursday to help them create resumes that will have them styling and manicuring in no time.


The trio of coaches worked with dozens of students to help them prepare resumes that will put them in the fast lane to employment.

"I believe our young people need a strong foundation to build upon and go out into the community to make a difference," said Danielle Mitchell, one of the coaches. She was assisted by fellow Schenectady County Connects representatives Marlo Valachovic and Lorena Flores.

Students said they appreciated the effort. "It's really cool to be able to work with a professional and learn how to build a resume that will get me hired," said Maritza Gonzalez, who attends the Career & Technical Education program from Mohonasen.

Schenectady County Connects is one of more than 300 businesses, education and labor entities that partners with Capital Region BOCES Career & Technical Education Center. The partners provide training, career-preparation events, work-based learning and internships that prepare Career & Technical Education students for careers that exist now and those that will exist in the future.

There are approximately 130 students from 24 school districts currently enrolled in the two-year Cosmetology program on the Albany and Schoharie campuses. Students in the program gain the skills and 1,000 hours of training and experience needed to take the New York State licensure exam. The experience prepares students to enter the workforce upon graduation or to go to college and a have a leg up on future business competitors. 
