Two of the most sought-out resources offered by Schenectady County Connects are the workshops led by experienced Career Counselors and the hiring events featuring local employers. While the pandemic led to the need for consideration of safety above all, our desire to maintain these in-demand services was the push we needed to enter the virtual world.

As part of the Capital Region Workforce Development Board we will be hosting Virtual Hiring Events throughout 2021 utilizing the Premier Virtual platform. With a structure that mirrors a traditional job fair, participants will have a chance to click in and out of each businesses' booth, share a resume, view job postings, and chat in real-time with employers who are hiring. On January 27 we held our first event which was a huge success - we hosted 35 businesses and more than 200 job seekers!

The virtual workshops that are being rolled out in February have been completely revamped and will be presented using the Zoom meeting platform to maximize the ability for interaction. We hope you'll check out these great new offerings!



Train for Change



One of the biggest shifts we had due to the pandemic was the way we provide service to job seekers. Every year, we serve thousands of participants but that service starts well before someone is actively seeking employment. Through efforts including the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) grant, we maximized job readiness training to help advance skills for customers to obtain employment, pursue industry-recognized certifications, create career pathways, and provide supportive services. In 2020, Schenectady County Connects was able to dedicate more than \$117,400 in financial-aid to 70 customers to support their training endeavors. Our customers are facing extreme economic challenges yet despite all of this, we see hope and opportunity for our community as customers increase their skillsets and prepare for the future workforce.

SUNY Oneonta Internships

The mission of Schenectady County Connects is to support our community by providing services to create a quality workforce and help people achieve self-sustainability. In 2020, our Director was called to support our larger community when she was told that her daughter's college, SUNY Oneonta, had a cohort of 10 Human Development and Family Studies students who were at risk of not being able to graduate in May 2021 unless they acquired an internship.

Through this initiative, Schenectady County Connects will be providing a completely virtual internship experience where these students will have the opportunity to learn about the various human service entities in Schenectady, foundational skills of professionalism in the workplace, and the ins and outs of the services we provide.

The pandemic has taken so much from so many that we couldn't let these 10 students fall short of graduation requirements when we have the ability to help. We are looking forward to this unique opportunity to live our mission and inspire the future workforce.
