Business Services

As a partner of the Capital Region Workforce Development Board and the One Schenectady coalition, Schenectady County Connects has identified and created responsive offerings to current business needs. Stimulus funding has provided much-needed relief across the country but it has left many businesses in need of qualified employees as they return to a state of normal operations.

Schenectady County Connects offers a full suite of business services (see below). The virtual hiring events have safely connected 487 job seekers with 112 local businesses. We have started an on-the-job training program where businesses can receive reimbursement for trainee wages, and we have begun a short video series to spotlight local business opportunities which thus far include STS Steel and Schenectady ARC.

Connecting Education to Employment

In February, we had the pleasure of partnering with the Mohonasen Business Advisory Board to meet with the Senior classes and engage them in an Interviewing Preparation series.



Step 1: Interviewing Workshop (9 sessions)



Step 2: Interview Stream Virtual Mock Interview



Step 3: Mock Interview with a Local Business



Through the connections that were made during this series, 65 youth registered for services through the Career Center, and many will have the opportunity to engage in Summer Youth Employment where they will connect with a Career Counselor to develop a transition plan leading to continued education/training or a career in an indemand industry.

This partnership has opened doors into other areas as well, we provided 14 resume and interviewing workshops to students at the Mohonasen Career and Technical programs and are also planning career education opportunities with Schenectady City School District.

Virtual Job Club

The process of finding new employment can be intimidating. Schenectady County Connects created a Virtual Job Club where job seekers are welcome to connect, find peer support, share job search strategies and job leads, and meet local employers.



Participants will engage in discussion topics relevant to today's job market and there is ample opportunity to dialogue, network, and develop peer support relationships along the way. Come once or come weekly, you choose, all are welcome!


