Michael's^{*} goal was to get into the medical field, and he took his first step by signing up for an EKG Technician course, however, he was stressed out about paying for it. His advisor recommended that he reach out to Schenectady County Connects for tuition assistance. He immediately connected with a counselor to do an intake and assessment. Michael learned about the process for requesting tuition assistance and hoped he would receive some funding. A week later, his employment counselor at Schenectady County Connects called him to give him the good news that he was approved to receive the full tuition amount for his course! He was incredibly excited that his tuition would be completely covered.

After a few weeks, Michael reached back out to his employment counselor because he desperately needed a job; he was applying to many locations and had interview after interview, with no luck. Michael was starting to become hopeless and frustrated, he even considered dropping his EKG Technician course. When he discussed this with his employment counselor, he received reassurance that he would land something soon and was encouraged to continue with his course. Michael's employment counselor told him that CSL Plasma was hiring, and he immediately submitted his application. Two days later, he was set for an interview, but he was very nervous. His employment counselor did a mock interview and gave him some tips to fully prepare him for the interview. A week later, Michael called his employment counselor to let her know that he landed the job! He was so excited to begin working and get his foot in the medical field. The employment counselor offered supportive services to Michael, such as purchasing scrubs and shoes for his job, and he was very appreciative of that.


